Recording Music (Break Down)

The music will be recorded in Cambodia by Officials and students at the School of Fine Arts

- Musicians Total \$900
 - O Qty (9) will receive \$100 each for their service from 8 AM 5 PM
- Sound and Recording **Total \$500**
 - o The whole package is \$500; this includes final MP3 audio and editorial files
- Singers Total \$600
 - Yann Borin, Professor of Khmer Vocals and retired singer of the Royal Ballet of Cambodia, will receive \$300 for his service
 - O Qty (2) other singers will receive \$150 each for their service
- Lunch and Food **Total \$150**
 - An allocation of \$150 will be used to serve lunch and dinner to 20 artists, including musicians and singers.
- Rental of the Hall **Total \$300**
 - Recording Hall is \$300 from 8 AM 5 PM
 - o Includes stage, lower stage, bathroom, lighting, and electrical

 - Qty (3) cost \$300 each (Copper Crowns) will be needed to fulfill the character's needs
- Skirts Total \$420
 - O Qty (8) cost \$52.50 each to produce
- Male Costumes **Total \$1400**
 - Qty (4) cost \$350 each, made in-house. This cost will cover the fabric, and the embroidered metal imported from India.
- Mask Total \$400
 - o Qty (2) cost \$200 per mask mold imported from Cambodia and painted in the US.
